The Right at Home Adult Day Centre offers a safe, friendly, and relaxing place for seniors and adults with physical disabilities to visit for the day and enjoy social interaction, freshly prepared food, games, activities and much more.

Our adult day centre is based inside Frederick House, Princes Court, Beam Heath Way, Nantwich, CW5 6PQ, which is located between Sainsbury's and B&M Bargains. There is plenty of onsite parking, including disabled parking.

Help will be on hand from our highly skilled and personable CareGivers to create an enjoyable and stimulating social environment.

We have partnered with Café Cortado, an onsite café offering a seasonal menu of freshly prepared hot and cold food. Fresh tea and barista style coffee is served in the morning and early afternoon, and each guest will be able to place their lunch order with the café, choosing whatever tickles their fancy.

Our trusted team of CareGivers have plenty of entertaining games to play with our guests, including board games, cards, jigsaws, quizzes, physical activities and much more. Our programme of activities will change on a daily basis, so no two days are the same.

Recipe Time – Chocolate Covered Halloween Pretzels

Ingredients

- :- 100g white chocolate chips
- :- 100g dark chocolate chips
- :- 100g milk chocolate chips
- :- 200g giant pretzels
- :- edible eyes (available in the baking aisle, or make your own)



Method

STEP 1

Melt each batch of chocolate chips in separate bowls, either in the microwave or set over a pan of simmering water. If melting in the microwave, heat each batch on high in 30-second bursts. Leave to cool until thick.

STEP 2

Dip a third of the pretzels into the white chocolate, a third of the pretzels into the dark chocolate and the remaining pretzels into the milk chocolate, then lay them all out on a sheet of baking parchment.

STEP 3

Add edible eyes to each pretzel (three eyes looks extra spooky). Leave to set, then peel carefully off the paper. Will keep in an airtight container for up to a week.

Tips for a Safe and Happy Halloween

Over the last few years, Halloween has become an increasingly popular celebration for children, families and young people. But It's important to think of those who may not like Halloween, and we should try not to have fun at the expense of others in our communities.

If you are celebrating Halloween this year, then please consider the elderly and more vulnerable members of your community who may find having strangers call at their door a frightening experience. You may come across someone displaying 'no trick or treat' posters; please don't call at these homes as they do not wish to be disturbed.

Some safety tips for Halloween:

Residents are advised to be vigilant when opening the door to strangers or unexpected callers:

- :- If you feel unsafe, don't open your door unless you are sure who is there. Use your spyhole or look out of a window, and use your door chain if you do decide to open your door.
- :- Have a contact number of a close relative or good neighbour to hand by your telephone, just in case you need to alert them of any concerns.
- :- If you are happy to welcome Trick or Treaters, switch on your outside light

and remove any trip hazards. If you use candle-lit lanterns outside your front door, make sure that they are far enough out of the way so that costumes can't accidentally catch fire.

- :- If you are driving during Halloween celebrations, remember that excited children may be crossing the road unexpectedly, so slow down in residential areas and take extra care.
- :- And if you are part of a
 Neighbourhood Watch scheme, let your
 coordinator know that you will be on
 your own at Halloween. If you are a
 coordinator, do identity people in your
 scheme that may be vulnerable and
 offer them reassurance.



Local community officers will often be on patrol to deter any anti-social behaviour and will be quick to disperse groups of people who are found to be causing a nuisance. To report anti-social behaviour, call 101. However, if you feel threatened, or see a crime taking place, then call 999.
